Fascinating Fact

The stretch of land from Costa Rica down through Panamá and into western Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru has the highest plant diversity anywhere in the world. Costa Rica alone has over twice as many tree species (around 2,000) than all of North America (around 1,000)!



The abundant rainfall in Costa Rica's Tilarán Mountain Range helps contribute to the diversity of tree species.
